## WorldFish - Sierra Leone

- Feed the Future "Scaling Up Agriculture" (SAP) through aquaculture (i.e. fish farming)
- Identified need for more training materials
- Asked partners to develop farmer-to-farmer training videos that teach aquaculture techniques





# Why F2F Videos?

#### AGRICULTURAL DEVELOPMENT:

- Relies on Information, Communication, and Technology (ICT) as an effective extension approach
- Benefits from better information available to farmers, which can lead to improved food security and nutrition

#### F2F VIDEOS offer:

- Cost-effective scalability
  - A video reaches many farmers
  - Translatable into any language
  - Geographically flexible
- Accessibility
  - Overcome literacy barriers
  - Copyright-free
- Relatability
  - Farmers are trusted messengers of improved practices

- WorldFish as client identified need for more training materials and provided consultation
- Partnership leveraged energies of study abroad students from Illinois and Njala students
- Technical videography
   expertise provided by Access

## Video Production Process









#### **Training**

- Access
   Agriculture staff train Illinois and Njala students on:
  - Story-telling through scripting
  - Professional videography methods

#### Scripting/Filming

- Video topics are driven by farmer input
- Scripts are drafted carefully to be simple, and clear and are scientificallyverified to ensure accuracy

#### Editing

- Video footage is artfully edited as a team
- Voice-overs are added in local languages

#### Dissemination

 Videos displayed on portable projectors or smart phones to reach many farmers
